

One lady was really happy to talk to us as she has a parent in need of a wheelchair ramp, and was going to contact us when it got closer to the time it was needed.

Four people stopped by our table just to say "thank you" for providing their child with an AmTryke[®]. They said their child was still enjoying the AmTryke[®]. When another one told us their child had outgrown their AmTryke[®], I told them to get in touch with us and we would upgrade them to a bigger model. I explained we would take back the old one and provide them with a newer one that would fit her better.

We also had three or four people stop to thank us for building a wheelchair ramps for their families. One of the mothers was really thankful for hers. We built it outside their back door into a fenced-in yard. This allows her son to go out and play in the back without her worrying about him. They are also getting a fully-trained dog to be his companion, so he would be able to let the parents know if something happened where their help was needed. One person gave us their email address so we could contact her to solicit donations. She had asked what mailing list we used to request donations and I was not sure that we had one. So she gave us the email so we could include her in the solicitations.

Overall I feel that this event was very good for us to be a participant. I hope we will continue this one, and hope other members of the club will be willing to volunteer an hour or two to help out!



Trevor is almost three years old and was so happy to receive his own bike. After just a few minor adjustments, Trevor was riding the bike on the sidewalk, and he also has a very nice concrete drive. His mother was very grateful, and feels the exercise will be very beneficial for Trevor. (Unfortunately, guess who forgot the camera.)

Later in August, we presented Thomas Knudsen with his AM-12 AmTryke[®] at Easter Seals. Thomas is five years old and has limited use of his left upper extremity. The AmTryke[®] will help him increase his functional independence and improve his aerobic capacity.

Below are a couple of pictures of Thomas and his therapist at Easter Seals just after receiving his own bike. He was so excited and ran across the room when we brought the bike into the room. Thomas had used a smaller AmTryke[®] in the past, but was ready for the bigger bike.
