First, we started a ramp for Mr. Claude Fowler on a cloudy evening... and found out that a metal carport was not a great place to "hang out" during a thunderstorm that evening... so we showed up the next day and finished a ramp for Mr. Fowler. He was glad we came back and is certainly glad we got his ramp finished!



We built a huge ramp for Mr. Jason Ziccarelli on Saturday, September 18th. Again, we started out with great weather... but got "baptized" around lunch time with a brief rain shower... so we took a break and came back and finished this 42 foot ramp with three platforms after lunch. I have to tell ya'... I stopped back to the site that afternoon to pick up some of the lumber... and I saw Jason way down the road... kicking his feet and propelling his wheelchair down the middle of the street. I stopped and asked him where he was going... and he said, "I'm out, I'm out... I'm goin' out to visit all my friends I haven't seen!... Thanks!" That's the difference... we are letting people "out"... so they can enjoy the weather, visit with friends, and be free to do whatever they want!



The last ramp we built was for a group of folks with disabilities at a home in Normal... managed by staff from the MarcFirst program. We started strong at 4:00p.m. and finished in the dark with my wife bringing the last few ballisters over to us so we could finish the ramp that evening! (I think that's gonna cost me...) We had some of the clients "supervising" our work throughout the evening... and had one of the clients give his final approval with a "thumbs up" as we packed up our tools at the end of the evening. I heard from the MarcFirst program... that they were impressed that we got the ramp done in one evening.. and that they are really enjoying their new found freedom, as well... for everyone who lives there and visits them.



Thanks again for all your extra help in getting our ramps completed this season. We still have several ramps to build... and we are welcoming the students from the Diversity Project again this fall... as they join us to learn about our program and what it means to help someone with a disability by truly giving "freedom" to another.
