February is AMBUCSTM Visibility Month. So, is that a big deal? AMBUCSTM might not get as much attention as this month's Super Bowl, but it should still be important to each of us. Like I've said here before, the more the rest of our community knows about us, the more likely that someone in need will be able to locate us when they need our help, and the more likely that someone else in the community will want to help us with a donation of time or dollars.

So, from an AMBUCSTM viewpoint, Visibility Month IS a big deal. Cornbelt is doing things as a club to spread the word. We've secured donated time on one of the electronic billboards in town. We've notified the Pantagraph. And we'll probably do one or two other things as a club before the month ends, but there are things I'd like each of us to do as individual members to increase our visibility. I've talked about several of them in this space before, but perhaps the simplest of them all is to wear your AMBUCS pin, and do it EVERY DAY THIS MONTH.

That's what I'm going to do. Join me. Go dig your pin out of the drawer where you're keeping it safe and proudly wear it on your collar, or on your coat (when the weather is cold enough that you actually need one), or the strap of your purse, or any other place where people will see it and ask you about it. This doesn't take a lot of time or cost a lot of money, but it goes a long way towards increasing our visibility.

The dictionary defines visibility as "the state or fact of being visible". So, when people see you this month, let them see AMBUCSTM too. Everyone you meet will see the pin, and some folks will ask you about. These short conversation, even 2 or 3 sentences, are the best way to increase awareness of our activities. This kind of 'personal publicity' can't be bought or shared through any media outlet. So, WEAR YOUR PIN and let people see that we are individuals committed to "creating mobility and independence for people with disabilities".

Don't forget that the application period for Therapist Scholarships is open. If you know a Therapist-in-Training, make sure they know about AMBUCSTM and our Scholarship Program. Direct them to our website, www.cornbeltambucs.org, where they can get the application info they need.
