She uses a power chair most of the time but was able to ride the bike around the yard with very little assistance. Chelsey and her family were surprised how well she did on the bike.

It was also great to work with the school therapist, Lisa Kelty. I am sure we will get an opportunity to work with her and the Streator Masonic Lodge again in the near future.
