I appreciate the extra help we had during the month... to continue our ramp-building efforts. Your dedication to our goals of accessible homes for people in our community was obvious when we had so many volunteers show up at our ramp projects this month.

For our first project, we were able to build a ramp for Mr. Pace in Danvers in February. We had plenty of help and were able to get his ramp done in a couple of hours on a Saturday morning. The family was very grateful and I'm sure their new ramp will come in handy when all this snow melts this spring!





Our second project was a little more complicated. We showed up at the Meadows Mobile Home park on a Saturday morning... to a small pile of lumber... and a big ramp "just down the street", as Jeff Schwartz confirmed. We were able to recycle a ramp that we had built for another family this past year. We disassembled a 30 ft. ramp, moved it down the street, and built a new platform for the Resendez family... to make their home accessible for their daughter, who uses a wheelchair. No snow that morning... but the cold and the wind certainly gave us a challenge. The ramp looks great and an extra "thank you" to all of our volunteers who helped us that day!



I will continue to keep you posted on our ramp projects and with the spring coming, we should have better conditions for our ramp-building projects.

AmTrykes®

Cornbelt AMBUCSTM provided a very nice young man an AmTryke® on National AMBUCTM Visibility Day, February 23, 2013.

Max received his new bike, a 1420 Pro Series, and was ready to go. He did not let a little snow keep him off the bike and sidewalks in his neighborhood. Max is legally blind but is able to recognize objects and did well keeping the bike on the sidewalk. He only got stuck a couple times in the snow and found out quickly the tires only spin on ice.

Mom was a little concerned when he figures out there are two additional speeds on this bike. Max was going pretty fast in first gear so Mom might get a lot of exercise when he learns how to shift into second and third gear.

Max was very inquisitive about how everything worked. As you can see from the pictures below Max really liked his new red bike. However, he wants a set of regular pedals without straps as he does not feel the foot pedal worked very well for him. He was quite able to ride the bike and I am sure he will be riding around their cul-de-sac.





This was the first bike with the new designed bucket seat. National AMBUCS TM has really improved the bucket seat. It is very stable and the belts are very easy to attach and adjust.
