The third ramp was built by Brian Burcham and the i-GATE group at State Farm for Mrs. Nichols in Bloomington. Mrs. Nichols had a lift installed inside her home and needed a way to get to her front door. Between the raindrops on a Saturday morning, they finished the ramp for Mrs. Nichols and she, too, has access to her own home, again.

# Notes From Al...





#### <u>AmTrykes®</u>

June was a very busy AmTryke® month for Cornbelt AMBUCS<sup>™</sup>. We began the month with a visit from Joe Copeland, our National Executive Director. Joe was here to help us with therapist AmTryke® training and to help perform AmTryke® evaluations.

The week began with picking Joe up at the Indy airport at midnight due to weather delays in Atlanta. At 8:30 that morning we had our first bike evaluation. It was for Braxton and according to Joe it was the first time he has ever taken the AmTryke<sup>™</sup> trailer to a person's home for an evaluation. Braxton did great and we were able to find the right 1416 ProSeries bike for Braxton. To see pictures of Braxton you will need to refer to the July 5<sup>th</sup> edition of The Pantagraph.

That evening, which was June 3<sup>rd</sup>, Joe conducted a therapist training session for 60 minutes at the Holiday Inn and Suites for 5 local therapist. They were from District 87 and SPICE. The therapist helped Joe perform bike evaluations for three children that evening. One family was there to find out more about the adjustments on the 1420 ProSeries bike their son received last month. Also, Grace was there to be evaluated for a future bike. We just put the foot platform on her AM-9 and now we need to adjust the hand cranks to help reduce her hip movements. In about a year we will need to order the AM-12 small with the snappy seat for Grace.

Also, at the Holiday Inn and Suites we evaluated Ethan for his bike. Ethan's bike was delivered the last week of June at Rosa Park. Ethan is working with his therapist from Easter Seals at several different playgrounds in the area. We made a few adjustments to an older style AM-9 for Ethan and as you can see from the picture below the bike is working great. When he grows we will need to order him a new bike in probably two years.



On June 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> we performed therapist training in Ottawa, Channahon Park (near Joliet) and with the Pekin Chapter of AMBUCS<sup>™</sup> in Peoria at Easter Seals. The picture below is Joe conducting the training at Ottawa. This was an exciting evening as a 22 year old girl, with Autism, rode a bike for the first time in her life. We are meeting on July 8<sup>th</sup> with several people from LaSalle County to get a new chapter started there and help fund the bikes for the 6 people we completed evaluations on after the training. There is still hope to get a chapter started in the Joliet area also. The picture below is from the training session in Ottawa. Also, need to thank District 4A for the use of their AmTryke® trailer.



Also in Peoria a 28 year old young lady from Pekin was able to ride a bike for the first time in her life. We had a difficult time getting her off the bike. Fox News was there and got a great quote from her, ". . . now I can ride with my friends . .". Unfortunately, I do not have a copy of the newscast to share.

Cornbelt also working with the Mason in Marseiles have another bike to deliver soon to a young girl and were able to repair an AM-12 which had a broken part. The bikes will be taken back to Marseiles on July 8<sup>th</sup>.
