<u>AmTrykes®</u>

Even though Cornbelt Ambucs[™] did not provide any bikes last month we have been active.

We have two children with evaluation forms in the works. One has outgrown his AM-9 small and looking for a little larger bike and the second is a child at Easter Seals who will be getting his first bike. Hopefully we will have pictures of both kids next month. I realize it may seem like we are not as involved as in the past but it always slows down at the end of the school year and during the summer months.

Joe Copeland, Ambucs™ Executive Director, and I borrowed the District 4A AmTryke® trailer and did a little road work in May. We visited the Peoria Easter Seals and Joe did a bike training session with the therapist and then with the assistance of the Pekin Ambucs™ we help fit 9 kids on bikes that afternoon.

On Tuesday morning we traveled to Madison, Wisconsin for a bike day at a pediatric therapy clinic and helped fit about ten kids on bikes. Unfortunately there is not an Ambucs[™] chapter in their area so these little guys will be going on the wish list soon.

Wednesday we travel to Tomah, Wisconsin for another bike presentation. Tomah is a beautiful little city with a great military presence with an Army base, a National Guard Unit and a large VA Hospital in the town. Joe did another training session with the therapist and then we helped find the right bike for 10 wonderful kids. However, the best news about Tomah is they signed a new

club building permit that night and are ready to start a chapter in Tomah, WI soon. They were already working on finding funding for the bikes and one of the therapist who signed up works at the VA Hospital so they will have a great connection with helping some disabled veterans get bikes to ride.

Thursday evening we were in Peru, Illinois with the I80 chapter. This is the chapter Cornbelt helped start last year. They are doing great and found about 8 more kids that need an AmTryke®. With the ten for ten program for new chapters they already have most of the funds for these new bikes.

Yes, this was a great trip and it was very exciting to see so many young kids get the opportunity to ride a bike for the first time in their life. I hope we can have another bike rodeo next year in Bloomington and Joe can help train the therapist in our area.
