
Save the Date - Tuesday, September, 16

Thanks a million for all your help this month! We built two ramps big ramps!.. and we needed quite a bit of extra help to get them completed.



AmTrykes®

In August Cornbelt Ambucs[™] helped a family in Aurora, IL obtain an AmTryke® for their son. This story began in March with a conversation with Alex's grandparents while Dee and I were visiting friends at The Villages in Florida. They mentioned one of their grandchildren had Autism and I asked if he has a bike to ride. They indicated his parents had tried training wheels and a few other options but no luck.

I sent them a picture of a few of our bikes and they forwarded these to their daughter. She visited with Alex's therapist and they wanted to give an AmTryke® a try. Alex's uncle, who paid the full cost of the bike, and I delivered the AmTryke® to Alex.

Unfortunately, Alex came out of the house, took one look at the AmTryke® and then returned to the house. He demonstrated no interest in the bike. The parents felt bad and were willing to donate the bike to someone else. However, I encouraged them to keep the bike for a few weeks and see what happened.

Two days later I received an email informing me Alex is riding the bike twice a day and loves his bike rides. The parents, uncle and grandparents are so excited that Alex now has a bike he can ride and get some very much needed exercise. I got a note from the grandparents and they are looking forward to getting to see Alex ride his bike this summer.

We have one bike ready to present to a 30 year old man who has never been able to ride a bike before and a couple request for bikes for board approval at this time.
