

July was a busy AmTryke® month for Cornbelt Ambucs[™]. A group of us assembled three bikes at Mid West Food Bank early in the month. I hope you were able to see Denny's pictures on Facebook.

On July 30th a few Cornbelt members were at Easter Seals to present two bikes. One was to Kaden and he loved his bike. Kaden's bike was fully funded by a family member. Kaden is seen at Easter Seals and the bike was recommended by Michelle Bayer, therapist. The family wanted Kaden to have a bike he could rider with his little brother and friends in the neighborhood. As you can see from the pictures below Kaden did not have any problem adjusting to the bike. Larry was having a hard time keeping up with him in the parking lot.





About three days after Kaden received his bike I received an email from the parents asking if there was a way to increase the gears to make the bike a little harder to ride. It seems he was going too fast and they were having a hard time keeping up with him and he turned just a little too sharp a few times. We will be working with the family to move the hand break to the back of the bike if necessary.

The second bike was going to a beautiful little girl who unfortunately was not having one of her best days. She was not going to get on the bike so we decided the next best option would be to deliver the bike to her home the next morning. However, upon arriving at the home the mother informed us the family made a significant decision and they were going to go back to Ethiopia for 2 years. I thanked her for letting us know and they will contact us when they return to the United States and the Bloomington/Normal area.

We still have two bikes to present and two more bikes on back order. Please continue to let me know if you become aware of anyone who could benefit from one of our specially designed therapeutic bikes.
