I have to admit, I was not planning to finish this ramp in one evening, but we had volunteers from everywhere (including Germany!) show up to build this 40 ft. "beauty". AmTrykes®

Even though we did not give away any AmTrykes® in September in McLean County it was another busy month.

Cornbelt presented a disable veteran a bike and a beautiful little girl an Amtryke® at National Conference in Biloxi, MS. Denny and Vicky Strauss also sponsored another child with a bike at the Amtryke® rodeo on Saturday morning. Sorry I was busy making announcements and trying to get over a cold and was not able to capture pictures. However, they were all very happy to receive their own bikes.

Also, the AM-10 (formerly the AM-9) and the 1410 (formerly the Oceana) bikes arrived and were assembled. These two bikes are on the same style frame as the AM-12 and AM-16, just a lot smaller. We will not be ordering bikes from Kettler in future as they discontinue to produce the Oceana. We are scheduling presentation dates and times. Hopefully one of the families can make our November 4th noon meeting.

Cornbelt also agreed to purchase a 1420 for a disable veteran living in Bloomington. The therapist is located at the Danville VA. The 1420 is a hand and foot powered bike that recently became available. Pictures will follow but probably not until December.

We have received the back ordered parts for the two bikes the region purchased and Larry will be dropping off the parts soon. We are also working with a couple therapists there that have expressed an interest in forming an Ambucs[™] chapter in the Quad Cities.

Larry and I will be doing a bike show in October in Morris, IL Larry has been in contact with a therapist group there and hopefully Cornbelt can encourage another new Ambucs[™] chapter.
