

April was a great month for Amtryke® activity. Cornbelt Ambucs™ presented our second disabled veteran with a bike at the Central Regional Conference.

Nels Madsen from LeRoy received his new JT 2000 during the lunch at the conference. As you can see from the picture below, Nels was very glad to receive his bike. Now I have to find time to get the bike to his home in LeRoy. Nels was referred to Cornbelt Ambucs™ by his therapist at the VA center in Danville, IL.



A significant education part of the Central Region Conference was the Amtryke® Road Show presented by our national Executive Director, Joe Copeland. All the chapters were asked to invite the therapist they work with and to offer to fit a few kiddos on the bikes after lunch. Cornbelt had 4 therapists in attendance and had 2 children evaluated Friday afternoon and 3 Saturday after lunch. Thus we had 5 kids who needs bikes. We are still collecting all the necessary documents to order the bikes.

We also received another request from a therapist at Advocate BroMenn Medical Center for a 60 year old veteran who could benefit from a JT 2300. Looks like we are really getting into the veterans program with our bikes. We also received two Ambuc™ Membership applications from Disabled Veterans during the conference.

This means Cornbelt needs to purchase and assemble at least 6 Amtrykes® for delivery soon, so they can be used when the nice Illinois weather finally gets here. So watch for the Amtryke® assemble notice once the bikes are received.

# Donate

The Cornbelt AMBUCS™ website has been updated with a "Donate" page. This provides new ways for people to donate to us. It provides the USPS address to mail a check, and more importantly, the ability to donate via credit card or PayPal. The money goes to a PayPal account and is then transferred to our Charity checking account. The cost is 2.2% of the donation plus \$0.30 per transaction. Example, for a \$100 donation, we receive \$97.50.

The "Donate" button is on most pages, and is a menu option. We also have a card reader that attaches to a smart phone so we can receive donations at events, when appropriate. It is now easy to donate to Cornbelt AMBUCS™ – spread the word!
