June was a busy Amtryke month for Cornbelt AMBUCS. After assembling the bikes ordered as a result of Central Region Spring Conference we were able to deliver most of the bikes.

After we assembled all the bikes we presented our newest member, Gregory Gastelum, with his new JT 2300. Greg is a veteran and unable to ride a conventional bike due to the nature of his back injuries. He was very pleased with the bike. Unfortunately along with no pictures of the bikes being assembled that evening we did not get a picture of Greg on his new bike.

Only few days later we were able to connect with Hunter, his therapist and family at Easter Seals. As you can see from the picture Hunter really enjoyed riding his new 1410 Amtryke. This is the new style for our early intervention bike. Also, you will note, Hunter's legs are very short but we were able to make the necessary adaptions to allow the bike to work well for Hunter. He was leaving later that morning and was looking forward to riding his new bike all around Chicago. I hope the family was able to keep up with him.



Our next trip was to McLean to replace Joey's bike. Joey has grown and now needs the 1420 XL. The 1420 XL is significantly longer than the 1420 and will allow room for Joey's growth in the future. Joey is a strong young man who loves to ride his bike on the streets of McLean. So if you are on the North side of McLean watch for Joey's smiling face on his new bike. This is Joey's third Amtryke. The first one was delivered on December 23rd. I hope you can see the joy in Joey's face in the picture below.



Our next bike recipient was Miles at Bloomington Junior High School. Miles was ready to go before we could be all the straps tightened. Miles has worked with Karen Klein, Therapist, for several years and Karen is so good to work with on getting the right bikes for the kids she works with through the school system. I think Miles just might wear the solid rubber tires off his bike.



Later that day we were at Easter Seals to deliver bikes to Camden and Brayden. Jillian McGriff, Easter Seals therapist, was great at getting the twins on their bikes. Camden and Brayden were born several weeks early and both have cerebral palsy. Brayden bike worked very well but we have a few more adaptions we need to be performed prior to Camden being able to successfully ride his bike. The Cornbelt AMBUCS website has been updated with a "Donate" page. This provides new ways for people to donate to us. It provides the USPS address to mail a check, and more importantly, the ability to donate via credit card or PayPal. The money goes to a PayPal account and is then transferred to our Charity checking account. The cost is 2.2% of the donation plus \$0.30 per transaction. Example, for a \$100 donation, we receive \$97.50.

The "Donate" button is on most pages, and is a menu option. We also have a card reader that attaches to a smart phone so we can receive donations at events, when appropriate. It is now easy to donate to Cornbelt AMBUCS – spread the word!

Volunteer Activities

State Farm Grant and Matching Gift Programs

State Farm has done a phenomenal job over the years in giving back to the community. And, as many current & past State Farmers know, there are a couple of ways that State Farm partners w/employees & retirees to do just that.

Through the Good Neighbor Grant & Matching Gift programs, State Farm will either match your donation of funds or provide a grant to those qualified organizations that you contribute volunteer time to. As of July 1st of this year there are some updates to those programs that I urge you to look into.

State Farm Companies Foundation is expanding the Matching Gift Program to not only include qualified non-profits, but to allow for participation to more than one organization. Matching gifts to US colleges & Universities will not exceed \$3000 per calendar year & non-profit matches will not exceed \$1500 over the same time frame. The Good Neighbor Grant Program awards a \$500 grant on behalf of each associate who volunteers a minimum of 40 hours per calendar year to an eligible non-profit.
