As you can see from the pictures below Violet is a lovely young girl who loves to ride her new Amtryke. Violet suffers from gross motor delay, short stature and hypotonia. However, she took right to the 1410 Pro Series bike and was ready to ride it very easily. She was telling her mother she wanted to ride her new bike on family walks. Mom really liked the rear steering and the ability to help Violet as she often gets tired on the family walks and had to be carried home prior to getting her Amtryke.







Shoulders together is our moto and we had an opportunity to help the Danville chapter recently. I was in Danville to pick up the Amtryke trailer prior to our trip to Cedar Falls. At the meeting they were looking for a time to assemble a JT 2300 and deliver it to a veteran in Peoria. Since they are so nice to let us use the trailer I offered to assemble the bike and deliver it for them and save them a few hours and miles. Last week I finally was able to connect with David and deliver the new JT 2300 to him. David was severely injured in an automobile accident about a year ago and has made significant progress. He feels the Amtryke will play a vital part is regaining his strength and endurance in the near future. David had just returned from duck hunting when I delivered the bike.
