 replacing Greg Ferris.



Notes from Al...

Fortunately our AmTryke® activity is beginning to pick back up. Cornbelt AMBUCS™ presented an AM-12 AmTryke® to Andrew Peterson on June 24th at Easter Seals. Andrew and his family found out about our AmTryke® program through an event at United Cerebral Palsy hosted by Megan.

As you can tell Andrew was quite excited and was ready to go down the halls at Easter Seals. Andrew also could not wait to get home and detail his bike with a few star wars stickers. He is also looking forward to riding his bike with his brother and family. I have a strong feeling it will not be too many years and Andrew will be ready for a much bigger bike. I have another AM-12 assembled and ready for another child through Easter Seals. We are waiting for the final paper work and appropriate time to present the bike. He has been riding the older model AM-12, which is much harder to pedal and operate than the new one.



We are also working with a therapist at SPICE on bikes for two young children. Hopefully we can have new bikes for them soon and they can enjoy the bikes outdoors. SPICE also had a bike returned which we will be picking up soon and determining if it can be used for another child.

The Rodeo at National Conference in Reno was a major success again this year. AMBUCS gave away 40 AmTrykes® that afternoon. We had great coverage in the local paper prior to the conference and local television coverage at the Rodeo. They interviewed several of the children who received bikes and their parents. There were not many dry eyes in the area as these wonderful kids rode their AmTrykes® out of the fitting and assembly area.

Attached are a few pictures of Rebecca, her family, her therapist and the new AmTryke® Cornbelt sponsored for the Rodeo. Rebecca was so sweet and did very well on her bike. She really liked the bright red helmet, even though the picture may indicate otherwise. Her family was very thankful and made a financial donation to National AMBUCS™ before they left that afternoon. One of the therapist in the Reno area worked with a local foundation, which she had a very close relationship, and was able to secure a \$10,000 donation to help cover a

portion of the cost of the 40 bikes which were given away. Also the Hotel provided National AMBUCS™ with a \$500 donation for the Rodeo, which may have covered some of the AMBUC™ member losses the night before in the casino.
