Elexa is a beautiful 8 year old girl who has never been able to ride a bike independently due to her Cerebral Palsy. She has wanted to have her own bike and the ability to ride independently for several years. Cornbelt AMBUCS<sup>TM</sup> made this possible and as you can see from the following photo. She adapted quickly to her new red bike and did not want to stop riding so we could make some final adjustments. Dennis and Cathy were there and Dennis was very helpful in getting the front brake working properly. Also, you can see Elexa's wonderful District 87 therapist, Karen Klein, trying to keep up with Elexa in the photo. Karen has help us deliver and fit several children on AmTrykes®.



Elexa's bike was funded by donations to Cornbelt AMBUCS<sup>TM</sup> in reference to a small birthday party for Dennis Wentworth. (I think I previously in error indicated it was in reference to Cathy Wentworth's birthday.) Dennis requested donations to AMBUCS<sup>TM</sup> rather than gifts and his friends were very generous.
