AmTrykes®

Yes, the holiday season is upon us and it begun big time in November for Cornbelt AMBUCS™.

First, Bill Fulton from the Danville chapter said he was having troubles sleeping at night with so many children on the National AMBUCS™ Wish List. So he started a challenge to take kids off the wish list and in time to have their bikes by Christmas. AMBUCS™ across the county jumped on this challenge and raised over \$115,000 and yes Cornbelt members were part of the program. That is what AMBUCS™ can do when we put our shoulders together.

On the 13th of November Cornbelt AMBUCS™ presented Naomi with her new 1410 series Amtryke®. The 1410 Amtryke® replaces the Oceana. As you can see it is foot power and has regular handle bars. Naomi had been riding an older version of the Oceana while she waited on the new bike to arrive. She was a little shy at first but started riding the bike all around Easter Seals as soon as I left the room. You can see her beautiful smile in the pictures below.





It was only a few days later we were able to present Dusti with her new 1420 Pro Series bike. Dusti lives in Atlanta but sees her therapist in Lincoln so her bike was presented at Lincoln Memorial Hospital rehab clinic. Her younger brother received an Amtryke® a few years ago from the Springfield chapter. Dusti's mother was so proud on how much the Amtryke® helped her son and is looking forward to the opportunity for the entire family to ride together. We were able to change the rear gear on this bike to allow Dusti the ability to coast as soon as she demonstrated the ability to break on her own.

As you can see from the two pictures below Dusti and her therapist were really enjoying the bike. I wish you also could have seen the smile on mom's face. I think we might get that request for new tires for this bike as I think she will be riding all over Atlanta.



I was out of town for a few weeks and upon my return Cornbelt was able to present our first bike to a disabled veteran on November 24th. We found out about Russel through the Danville chapter that is now working closely with the Illiana Health Care Center at the Danville VA Hospital. Russell's therapist recommended the bike to allow Russell to get more exercise and outside activity. I think the pictures below clearly illustrate how pleased Russell is with his new bike.





Unfortunately, when we took the bike for a test run that afternoon we had the bike in the highest gear and tried to start riding up a hill. This was too much stress and we broke the chain. However, we still were able to fit Russell on the bike and the chain was repaired quickly. Russell was riding his new bike the next afternoon after returning from his therapy session in Danville.



Since Country Financial has provided Cornbelt AMBUCS™ with financial support for a few years we asked them to attend our first bike presentation of a Disabled Veteran. They brought a few from their Military Support Group to see Russel get his new bike. They were all pleased and asked how they can help in the future. We look forward to continuing this relationship.

As of now we do not have anyone on our waiting list so I am not sure we will be wrapping a big red bow on a bike in December. However, if you know someone who could benefit from an Amtryke® please send us their contact information. We can often get bikes pretty quick as the holidays get close.
