January was another typical slow month for Cornbelt Ambucs and Amtryke activity.

Currently we do not have anyone on our waiting list and have not provided an Amtryke in several months. I recently contacted several of the therapist we have worked with in the past and asked them to let us know if any of their kiddos could benefit from one of our bikes. I also, offered to repair any bikes that needed a little tender loving care. Let's hope we hear from them soon so we can have bikes for the kiddos to ride when the weather warms up.

If you know or are visiting with a therapist please let them know about our program and ask them to contact me with any questions or potential riders.

I am also planning on a few bike day trips this spring to chapters Cornbelt chartered. District 4A is so generous with their very well equipped trailer.

On February 21st we will be doing a bike day in Morris, IL for the Grundy County Ambucs. They have 10 possible Amtryke riders to be evaluated and fitted on one of our bikes. Then the next night, February 22nd I 80 will be holding their annual spring bike day in LaSalle, IL. They often have between 10 and 15 kids to be evaluated.

On March 3rd I with the trailer will be in St. Louis to help out the pediatric chapter in St. Louis evaluate 20 kids for bikes.

Not for sure but it looks like we will be in LaCrosse, Wisconsin on Saturday, April 21st and then in Naperville, on Sunday, April 22nd for bike days. Still waiting to hear back from the Mississippi Bend and I Hope chapters in lowa. Looks like a busy spring, please let me know if you would like to assist.
