Cornbelt AMBUCS Scholarships



Over the years Cornbelt AMBUCS has proudly supported many outstanding students on their path to becoming a Physical Therapist. This month we want to acknowledge the Huber family for their annual funding of a local scholarship in honor of their late brother Don.

The Don Huber Memorial Scholarship is awarded annually by Cornbelt AMBUCS and is fully funded by the Huber family in the amount of \$2,000. It would take too much print space to list

everything Don did for our chapter, but it began when he joined Cornbelt in November of 1988 and ended with his passing on Valentine's Day in 2002 at the age of 60. From ramp building to fundraising to being chapter president Don wore his big hat with pride. He wasn't only a superior chapter member but a superior friend to many in our chapter who still miss him to this day.

Don was the youngest of a large close knit farm family, all boys and one girl. The entire family helped take care of their brother Lyle who was born with mobility problems. As Lyle grew older his physical problems deteriorated and as a result he has been a quadriplegic for decades. Don had a special reason for being such an avid AMBUC member and he lived it every day.

Each year the Huber family has sent us a check for the memorial scholarship. It has not been uncommon to receive a few months later an additional check for one or two thousand dollars to fund Amtrykes and ramps. We are always pleased that each year at our annual installation banquet some of Don's family could attend. They are all part of our Cornbelt family.

It is with sadness that as time has marched on the Huber family can no longer fund this scholarship. Don's brothers and sister have been very generous and supportive, but if you put together the facts mentioned in the previous paragraphs the ending writes itself. Don was the youngest sibling and died at the age of 60 in 2002. Two of the Huber brothers have already passed away. We recently received a check that will fund five more years of their brother's memorial scholarship.

Thanks to the generosity of Don's brothers and sister there are many outstanding physical therapists doing their job today. Those students greatly appreciated the financial help and enjoyed a chance to say thank you to the Huber's at our installation banquets. The Huber family's support certainly raised awareness of scholarships in our own chapter as we have strived to provide more local financial support each year.

Cornbelt AMBUCS is proud to have had Don Huber as a member and we're certain Don would be even more proud of his brothers and sister for their support of scholarships through the Cornbelt Chapter of AMBUCS. And those of us who knew Don personally, we still deeply miss our friend.
