<u>Amtrykes®</u>

Last month was an exciting month. We build three bikes in my garage one night and then proceeded to give two bikes. We also received another bike to be assembled and another Amtryke request.

On May 15th we presented two bikes to kiddos at Sarah Raymond School of Early Education. Kara Thompson is the physical therapist we worked with on these two bikes.

The first one was provided to Braden. Braden is 3 year old child with autism. He ambulates with an ataxic like gait and often stumbles. He had a tricycle at home but was unable to propel the bike. As you can see from the picture below he really liked his new 1410 Amtryke. With the rear steering the father will be able to give him just the right amount of assistance.



The second bike was a 1412 Pro Series Amtryke to Peyton. She has CP and is determined she can get around and wants to participate with her friends. Kara was sure the Amtryke would help her develop the skills necessary to improve her mobility. This is the first bike we have used the calf leg supports to work with her leg supports. As you can see, she was ready to go and enjoyed riding her new red Amtryke all around the school gym,



We also received and installed the rear steering kits for Rex's 1420 XL Pro Series Amtryke he received at our pancake breakfast. His mom indicated he has been riding the bike and they are looking forward to having the rear steering in place.

June looks like another busy month. Already have one Amtryke to assemble and two Amtryke request waiting for board approval. So watch for email notifications of upcoming Cornbelt Amtryke events.

Also, in May I borrow the Amtryke trailer for a long road. Started with a brief trip to Peoria Easter Seals assisting both the Pekin and new East Peoria chapters in fitting kiddos on Amtrykes. Then with the large white trailer full of demonstration Amtrykes behind me I left for La Crosse, Wisconsin, then therapist centers in St. Cloud, Minnesota, Hillsboro, Fargo, Bismarck and Minot, North Dakota. Yes, that was over 2,600 miles but a very productive trip. Kristina Bouley, Occupation Therapist, from Bismarck accompanied me on the trip. There is a good possibility of two if not three new chapters as a result of the trip.
