Al and I attended the picnic put on by the Central Region, in July. Carmela Davis, the Big Hat President, drove up from Texas, just to meet us! That was pretty impressive! There were members from 5 different chapters, I believe. Each chapter received a badge for our banner, to commemorate Carmela's visit. We had a picnic with lots of good food, and we were able to tour a new Therapy Clinic. They will be using therapy animals and Amtrykes® there.

I wanted to let you all know about a sign-up sheet I created, for future ramp builds. We have communicated information about this previously, so it may sound familiar to you. If you are a retiree or employee of State Farm, you should be familiar with the State Farm Good Neighbor Grant. As you know, each of us as an individual is eligible to apply for a \$500 grant, to be applied to a non-profit of our choosing, once we put in 40 hours in a calendar year. Well, State Farm recently made a change to that program, and now each of us can apply 40 hours to an individual grant, and additional hours to a group grant. So, for future ramp builds, there will be a sign-up sheet on a clipboard, that we will keep in the trailer. If you are a State Farm retiree/employee, then after each build, please remember to sign the sheet, and enter the number of hours you worked that day. Once we get 40 hours total, I will apply for the group grant. Please be sure that you don't also count these hours towards your individual grant. The State Farm Guidelines also say that we can apply for more than one group grant, so I will be the leader on this first group grant, but I may ask one of the other State Farmers to apply for a grant, too. We may as well get whatever we can, to enable us to continue to do good in our community!

Registration for the National Conference is in full swing. The event will be held in Pittsburgh, Oct. 2 -5. This is a great place to meet your fellow AMBUCS members from around the country, and see what they are all doing. There will also be a bike build, a ramp build, instructional sessions, dinners, auctions, and fun! Some of the Cornbelt members will also be participating in the Trek 4 Trykes walk-a-thon, and you can show your support by contributing to their fundraising pages. If you are so inclined to do that, there is a link to the fundraising page in the email from National. Once you enter that page, you can enter a name, to go to that person's fundraising effort.
