#### <u>Amtrykes®</u>

During October Cornbelt Ambucs gave away two Amtrykes. We have several restrictions with the virus we must follow when giving an Amtryke away today. The major difference is we almost always have to present the bike outside and with few non-family members. It is difficult to not want to get down on the ground and help the therapist with the adjustments but today we need to avoid contact or being within six feet as much as possible. Therefore, we have not been inviting the membership to our bike giveaway. I hope this changes soon.

On October 5<sup>th</sup> at Marcfirst, Cornbelt Ambucs presented Logan with his new shiny red bike. Logan is an active 3 year old boy who wants to ride, but does not have the strength to ride a typical bike. The Amtryke will with help him improve his strength and improve his hypertonia. It is a little difficult to see but Logan was all smiles as he rode the bike. Even though you cannot see it, Amanda, the physical therapist at Marcfirst, was very pleased with how well Logan was doing.





In late in October, in front of the Colfax Elementary School we presented Colton with his new beautiful Amtryke. Colton is 5 years old and lives in rural McLean County. He has 4 brothers and sisters at home and recently demonstrated an interest in his sister's tricycle, but it is too small for him.

As you can see from the picture, Colton and his therapist, Dorene, along with his mother were truly excited to see how well Colton has adjusted to riding his new Amtryke. The face mask makes it difficult to see the smile on Colton's face.







Both Logan and Colton's Amtrykes were Amtrykes that were returned to Cornbelt Ambucs so another child could have a bike to ride. We also received a request for an AM-16 for a very special family which will be ordered soon for a daughter of one of our members. Hope her new bike will be here soon. We also have been advised the 1420 and 1416 Pro Series bikes on back order should arrive soon.
