Amtryke® News from A

Unfortunately, I do not have any good news on Amtrykes being received.

At this time, we only have four Amtrykes that can be recycled in our inventory. They are:

A 1410 early intervention foot tryke

An older style 1410 early intervention foot tryke

An older style small AM tryke that is only foot powered. Just a little larger than the 1410

And a 1416 (3 speed) Pro Series Amtryke. A rider would not have to shift the gears and it would work like a regular 1416.

We do not have any request for any bikes currently. It appears we will not be receiving the bikes we ordered a month ago until September 2022. Our local therapists are aware of our problem in getting bikes and realize what a child will need next September will change and they are not sending us any request.

One or two Ambuc chapters have tried to purchase therapeutic bikes from other suppliers and have found the same problem. There are just not any bikes available today.

Dee and I want to wish everyone a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year and if you are like me, will be glad when 2021 is over.

- Be sure to have your Kroger Plus card handy and register your card with your organization (Cornbelt AMBUCS) after you sign up.
- If you do not yet have a Kroger Plus card, you can get one at the customer service desk at any Kroger.
- · Click on Sign In/Register
- If you are a new online customer, you must click on SIGN UP TODAY in the 'New Customer?' box.
- Sign up for a Kroger Rewards Account by entering zip code, clicking on favorite store, entering your email address and creating a password, agreeing to the terms and conditions
- You will then get a message to check your email inbox and click on the link within the body of the email.
- Click on My Account and use your email address and password to proceed to the next step.
- Click on Edit Kroger Community
 Rewards information and input your Kroger Plus card
 number.

- Enter NPO number (73396) or name of organization (Cornbelt Chapter), select organization from list and click on confirm.

- REMEMBER, purchases will not count for us until after you register your Kroger Plus card.
- Do you use your phone number at the register? Call 800-576-4377, select option 4 to get your Kroger Plus card number.
- Members must swipe their registered Kroger Plus card or use the phone number that is related to their registered Kroger Plus card when shopping for each purchase to count.
