With special thanks to Jeanie, we now have two 1416 Pro Series Amtrykes on back order.

The first order was placed last month and the second one just recently. We have been waiting for the completed evaluation form for over a month. With school out it looks like we were going to have to wait until school started again for the school therapist to complete the Amtryke Evaluation form. However, Jeanie came to the rescue. She quickly arranged a meeting with the family and completed the required paperwork. Thanks again Jeanie.

Unfortunately, both bikes are out of stock and will not be available until this fall. But at least the orders have been placed.



Cornbelt Ambucs sponsored one of the Amtrykes given away at National Conference last week. Eden received a 1416 Pro Series Amtryke. As you can see from the pictures below, he did not have any problem motivating the new Amtryke around the path in the conference room. All the Cornbelt members at the conference quickly got in the photo shoot with Eden.



While also at the National Conference I got an opportunity to see the design of the new Amtrykes. The larger bike will replace the 1416, the 1420 and the 1420 XL. The smaller one will replace our 1410 and 1412. Both bikes only require a couple wrenches for assembly and will have additional options. They are hoping to have the bikes in production mode in early 2024.







During the Central Region meeting at National Conference, I asked if anyone had a 1416 new or recycled that we could purchase since our two on back order will not be here for a couple months. A couple chapters are going to check. We also offered to let a chapter purchase the 1420, 1420XL and AM12 stored in my garage. There are children waiting for these bikes, so they need to be used until the back ordered bikes become available. Vicky and I will be working on a Central Region site for chapters to list their Amtryke needs and extra bikes and parts they have available. Everyone will benefit from this information.
