Donating as a Retiree - Don. Smith (Lawton, OK Chapter)

Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) and Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD)

RMD: Once individuals reach the age of 73, they must start withdrawing a minimum amount annually from their retirement accounts (excluding Roth IRAs).

QCD: Allows IRA owners who are 70¹/₂ years or older to directly transfer up to \$100,000 per year to a qualified charity without counting the distribution as taxable income.

Top Tip: If you plan to donate to the Cornbelt chapter AMBUCS, your church, or another charity or service accounts using a QCD, please ask your accountant or your financial institution to make the check out to the organization, but be sure to have the check mailed to you. Many organizations have trouble determining where a donation has come from and it's so much easier if you send the check on with details.
